David is an illustration major at the Rhode Island School of Design and Senior Assistant at RISD's Edna Lawrence Nature Lab. Recently, he has worked as an exhibit watercolor artist for the Harvard Museum of Natural History. During his residency at Harvard Forest, he will explore the relationship between red eft coloration and forest microclimates.

From David: "The way scientific information is presented can serve to illuminate or alienate the audience about a particular subject. [Art] communicates important information and 'data' about the natural world on a more emotional level. The intention of the finished work here is to bring the viewer into a dialogue with the red eft."

David will display his watercolors, photographs, sketches, and color studies upstairs in the Fisher Museum throughout his residency (Sept 1 to Sept 8). This residency is made possible in part by the LTEArTs Program of the National Science Foundation.
